I hope that this newsletter finds you all well, as we embark upon our first half term break; I am sure that all of us welcome a short holiday at this time. My family and I have planned to have a relaxing time together here in Abu Dhabi and I may even get the opportunity to get out onto the golf course!

When we reach marker points along the academic year, it is important for us as a school to evaluate everything from different perspectives: staff, student and parent perspectives. We receive feedback, immediately and retrospectively, from our students, staff and parents throughout the year, which is invaluable to us in our quest to perform as well as we can. Our efforts to do our best are the same that we ask of our children, as their best efforts are the most that we can ask for and their expectations of us should be no different.

We encourage our children to try their best in their assessments and evaluations. Taking risks and developing resilience is a valuable, useful and noble life skill that we develop here at BBS. Michael Jordan led and said through his own example:

"I have missed more than 9000 shots in my career. I've lost almost 300 games. 26 times I've been trusted to take the game winning shot and missed. I've failed over and over and over again in my life. And that is why I succeed." **Michael Jordan**

Letter from the Director of Studies

Dear Parents,

I would like to introduce myself as the school’s Director of Studies. Each week we will update you on the latest British Curriculum developments. The British National Curriculum is a set of subjects and standards used by Primary and Secondary schools to ensure students learn the same information. It covers what subjects are taught and the standards students should reach in each subject. We start with a basic overview of how the curriculum is created and how we design the BBS timetables.

Key stages The National Curriculum is organised into Key Stages (KS). At the end of each key stage, teachers formally assess each child’s performance.

- **Key Stage 1 – Years 1 and 2**
- **Key Stage 2 – Years 3, 4, 5 and 6**
- **Key Stage 3 – Years 7, 8 and 9**
- **Key Stage 4 – Years 10 and 11**
- **Key Stage 5 – Years 12 and 13**

During **Key Stages 1, 2 and 3**, all students are taught the same ten compulsory subjects at varying difficulty levels. The reason for this is to allow students to develop their knowledge each year they are engaged in education.

English	Mathematics	Science	History	Geography
Art and Design	Music	Physical Education (PE)	Computing	Modern Foreign Languages

During **Key Stage 4** the amount of compulsory subjects are reduced by 50% and the school provides an Options Programme of subjects for students to choose to studying in KS4. Options include: The Arts, Design & Technology, The Humanities and Modern Foreign Languages. These curriculum changes occur to encourage students to start thinking about their future careers and allow them to plan for their future.

Key Stage 5/Sixth Form is a term used to describe the two years of education for students aged 16-18, within the National Curriculum. Key Stage 5 is also the stage of education where students follow more intense and challenging courses in very specific subjects. This stage is the last stage of Secondary education for members of Sixth Form.

When students successfully complete their A levels they will be able to apply for university.





Year 2

We have had a very busy start to the first term.

Our theme was Fire, Fire, Fire and we have most certainly been blazing through! We've created some amazing artwork and really captured what the Great Fire of London would have looked like.



In English, we've been learning all about The Enormous Crocodile and his very sneaky tricks. We have written our own tricks, and created our own version of the story. We have used exciting openers and lots of adjectives.

In Maths we have been writing numbers in words and numerals, adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers, learning about symmetry and right angles, doubling and sorting using Venn diagrams. We have also used angle eaters, bead strings and base ten to make our numbers to see how many tens and unit they have.



Being scientists has been very interesting. We've been conducting experiments using different materials and you can ask us all about them. We know their uses, their properties and special words to describe them.

We are very excited for the next half of the term.

The first half of term 1 has been a busy one and all the children have had a great start to Year 3.

In Maths, children have been learning different techniques in adding and subtracting, telling the time and learning the properties of 3D shape.

In English, children have learnt all about different genres of books including nonfiction and fiction texts. They then made an information book, crossing the curricular and creating the book about animals in the rainforest.

In Science, the children have learnt about different types of animals and have started being introduced to scientific vocabulary.

In Topic, children have enjoyed learning about Rainforests and about all the different animals and plants you would find there. It has been excellent that we have finished the topic off by having the most wonderful Rainforest day!

In Topic we have explored The Olympics. We have compared how The Olympics have changed over time and we have also looked at different host cities in detail. We have enjoyed making The Olympic logo and have even made our own one.

In Science, we have looked at Electricity. We have studied circuits and we now know the difference between a closed and broken circuit. We have looked at the different parts of a circuit as well as their symbols.

In English, we have written both Fiction and Non-fiction texts. We know how they differ and what features are linked to both of them. We have also explored newspaper articles and know what to include when writing one. We recently wrote a newspaper article about the weather in Abu Dhabi.

In Maths we have been continuing to look at addition, subtraction, multiplying and dividing. We also have studied fractions and know how to find a fraction of a whole number.

It has been a busy half term and we look forward to the next half term!



YEAR 5 ANCIENT EGYPT



We have been learning about Ancient Egypt. We have been learning about Egyptian history, ancient Egyptian culture, important figures in ancient, ancient Egyptian structures such as the Pyramids and how they were built, daily life in ancient Egypt.

We have been using our knowledge of ancient Egypt to write stories and informative pieces in Literacy. We have been creating posters and writing about ancient Egypt in our topic books.

What else did we do ?

In Literacy, we have been having 'Big Write' classes every Wednesday where students write a story using their imagination and creative skills.

We have been learning about adjectives, adverbs, verbs, pronouns and putting them into sentences. We have been reading James and the Giant Speech and identifying key vocabulary and putting them into sentences. We have been learning how to summarize information from a text. We have been inferring from stories and give opinions. We have been learning about, sequencing, compare and contrasting, drawing conclusions, self-questioning, problem-solving. In math, we have been learning how to add and subtract 3 and 4 digit numbers. We have been learning how to divide 2 and 3 digit numbers. We have been learning about prime and composite numbers and their relationship to factors and division and multiplication. We have been learning about fractions and how to simplify fractions and find the fraction of a number. We have been learning about equivalent fractions and finding fractions on a number line.



News from Year 6



In Science, we took a look at how to classify animals according to their characteristics as well as how each animal adapt to their specific environment/community. Children had the opportunity to create their own Curious creatures with characteristics of their choice by using clay. We also went walkabout on the school premises to identify the different Biotic and Abiotic factors around us.



During the first few weeks of our new academic year, we have been busy with many hands-on activities across the different subject we offer at BBS.



In Topic, we have looked at the Ancient Greek civilization in time as well as the Greek gods and goddesses. We have linked our Topic with our Literacy looking at Myths and Legends and writing their own version of Pandora's Box.

In English, we took a look at Fiction and Non-fiction texts. We also had a look at recounts, identifying different genres and their features, how to read and retell a story and then creating our characters to write our own Horror story. Children came up with outstanding pieces of work and we are looking forward to the next half-term where there will be plenty of opportunities for collaboration and teamwork.

Year 6

In Maths, we have been looking at addition, subtraction, division, multiplication, decimal, fractions and how we can apply them using different methods to solve problems. To bring all of the learning together, we gave students the opportunity to collaborate to design and construct their own Hexagonal football using hexagons and pentagons.
