Independent Learners

This week, I have been observing teachers and getting to grips with taking our school community through the preparations for our visit from ADEK (they call it an 'inspection', but I call it a good opportunity for professional and community development in the middle of which they will visit us and see where we are in our development, what we're doing, and what we are planning to do).

Then two things happened this morning: The first was when I listened to a feedback session where a teacher was discussing how her lesson went. The second was discussing with a parent about supporting her children with their homework and difficulties with their studies. From these discussions, I see how important it is to not only help our young people become more independent as learners about also understand more, for themselves, about their learning.

Let's look at independence. Teachers are often very good at teaching young people – it's their profession after all. However, our understanding of education sometimes becomes warped towards the idea of 'providing' the explanations and answers when young people come across new ideas, are challenged by questions or home assignments they are unsure of. Adults, as parents and educators, often fall into the easy trap of providing the answers or explaining things or rushing to help tie a shoelace or fix a phone. It seems the right thing to do – but is

In the extreme case, if an adult does everything for a child, the child may very easily become reliant on the adult. As the child becomes a teenager, they may resent that reliance and rebel. In either case we haven't nurtured them towards independence.

We need to help our young people become independent learners as much as we can. So, next time a child asks you something, try not to give them the answer or explanation immediately but give them instead an invitation to think or find out for themselves. Usually that means answering their questions with a question from you: Have you thought it through? What is it you don't understand? Have you tried other ways? Have you checked the textbook or internet? What could you do if you were on a desert island and your life depended on figuring this out for yourself?

It's not always easy to change from being an 'adult answer machine' to being a coach and a guide and, of course, it is sometimes counterproductive if you always answer young people's questions with questions. However, if you strike the right balance, and gently push or pull young people towards answering questions, solving problems and learning new things for themselves, they will gradually become more independent and get used to, and want to, take more responsibility for their own education. How would it be if your young people were, let's say, 20% more independent at learning than they are now? So, why don't we help them to be?

So, what about knowing more about their learning? Let's explore that next week but for now, I leave you with a question or two:

What would change if our young people knew why they were taught in the way we are teaching them at school or at home? What if they knew why we have tests, homework, and projects? What would change if they knew why we display their 'work' on boards around the school or why we ask them questions, create opportunities and challenges for them; why we set deadlines and are strict with them at times? What if they learnt why we have extracurricular activities, inclusion and differentiation? Would it make them better learners and wiser people?






INTERNATIONAL LITERACY DAY CELEBRATIONS AT BBS


This interaction highlighted the power of building relationships in the classroom while reinforcing the value of learning through engaging activities.

We are incredibly proud of their problem-solving skills and ability to translate theoretical knowledge into hands-on application!





Dear Students,


This is a crucial reminder that all students are required to wear their school ID cards visibly at all times while in our school. Failure to comply with this policy may result in a visit to the detention area.


As part of Jr. NBA Week, the NBA is providing 1st place winners of Season 3 the opportunity to experience playing at Etihad Arena.
