Trust and Communication and 'Going to ADEK'

I had just finished an admissions interview with parents who wanted to transfer their child to BBS having been seriously let down by their previous school. Their child had won a scholarship to their previous school but even that didn't matter - they wanted a transfer. They had spoken to friends abroad and were advised to try BBS. The friends, whose own children had attended BBS in previous years, urged these parents to try BBS – 'it's friendly, community-based and attentive'. As a new principal, I can see that. The systems – whether run by non-teaching staff, support staff, or by educators are sensitive and geared towards identifying issues and fixing them – often before there are any actual mishaps. You can tell when you walk in what sort of school it is friendly, attentive and responsive.

So, the after the interview with the family, I checked through some of my emails and saw that I had been copied into from a parent with a concern. The concern was genuine – the issue was, as it turned out, a misunderstanding in communication – but to that parent at that time, it seemed that there was a problem. The member of staff had written back politely explaining the situation and agreed to adjust matters so that such a misunderstanding would be unlikely to happen again. So, all good? Well, not really, and here's why...

The ADEK button

It is wonderful that we have parents who care enough to write in or visit us over issues – we either learn what we're doing wrong and improve or we have a chance to explain what we do and dispel misunderstandings. We encourage that. We're happy to improve and communicate. However, what I have noticed, in my few months here, is that some of our parents threaten to 'go to ADEK' in their first communication on an issue. It saddens me to see that because it suggests a lack of trust - and this is the point of my message here. We are trying to build a community of sorts and that needs to be based on trust. When I see a letter basically saying, 'if you do nothing about this, I will go to ADEK', it makes me feel that there is no trust.

At BBS, we take parent and student concern seriously. There shouldn't be a need to threaten us. Most likely, 'going to ADEK' will not bring the outcome better or sooner than we can. What it suggests to me is that parents who mention this have had a bad experience in the past – either at other schools or at ours. That saddens me.

So, if you have an issue, a suggestion, a question for us, please just write or visit us and let's discuss it. If we can't resolve the issue, then we can together go to ADEK and ask their advice. Let's build a community based on trust.




Year 7 Students Explore Solubility Through Hands-On Science

This week, our enthusiastic Year 7 students dove into the world of chemistry by investigating how temperature affects the solubility of substances. In an engaging practical experiment, students measured how much of a chosen solute dissolved in water at different temperatures, enhancing their understanding of a fundamental scientific concept.

Through teamwork and careful observation, students recorded their findings and discovered that solubility often increases with temperature. This activity encouraged them to apply critical thinking and scientific inquiry, skills that are essential in developing young scientists.

The curiosity of students was further sparked by discussions on the real-life implications of solubility—from dissolving sugar in hot tea to the environmental impact of temperature changes on marine ecosystems.


SOCIAL STUDIES

ADHD FACTS

Most cases are diagnosed under the age of 12, but you could be diagnosed at any age. The ratio of boys to girls with ADHD is 3:1 as it is harder to detect in girls. Boys tend to display symptoms of hyperactivity more often than girls.



The exact cause of ADHD is unknown, but evidence has shown that there is a genetic element.

It was a fantastic opportunity for our students to envision their futures and learn more about the steps required to reach their goals!






















Promotions
