Give or Take?

All last week and this, I seem to have been engaging in conversations with wonderful parents and young people. One of the things that stuck in my mind after all this was the perspective of 'providing an education'. Something didn't quite sit right.

Many schools and universities say that they 'provide an education' and, in many ways, they do. They have a building; they hire staff to run the building and to assemble a team of educators and supporters to 'provide' young people with some sort of education. I meet many students and parents who seem to think that it stops there – that that's all it takes.

In reality, what schools and universities provide are opportunities. The good ones will help their young people make the most of those opportunities. Having opportunities means making decisions, and the best schools will help their young people to make wise decisions.

When we have a lot to learn, it takes a very dedicated, disciplined, compliant student to learn all that material, pass all those tests and exams, and spend a great deal of their childhood learning to do so.














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PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Not all young people can or should do this. Does it mean those who can't, or don't want to be like this, are not so intelligent? No, it just means that we waste a lot of their time trying to force them to follow one pathway. They are bright, they can fulfil their great potential, but just not in this way.

So, in most systems, we get a smaller and smaller number of young people following the 'academic' route. It's not because they aren't perfectly intelligent people with great potential — it's because this is the pathway we give them. It doesn't have to be that way.

Taking.

How about if a young person comes to school to take their education? What if they say to themselves, 'There's a lot to learn, so I had better be good at learning.' What is it I need to learn? What will maximise my ability to learn that? They might begin to realise that waiting for a teacher to tell them what to do, sitting passively in a classroom being 'given' their education, will not be very challenging or engaging, and learning is always best when it is challenging and engaging. They might realise that their learning power will not be maximised if they are bored and unhappy.

So, what should such a young person do?

They need to start taking their education. Next week, we can discuss all about how to do that best – but in the meantime, what do you think?
















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WELCOME BACK TO TERM 3!

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VICE PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Say No to Private Tuition - A Shared Responsibility

Dear Parents,

As we approach the final stretch leading to external examinations, we want to discuss an essential matter concerning your child's academic preparation.

At Belvedere British School, we strongly believe in the quality of teaching and support provided within our classrooms. Our dedicated teachers follow carefully structured plans that balance delivering curriculum content and preparing students through targeted exam practice, including past paper questions. We are confident that our staff provides students with all the tools they need to succeed. We would also like to remind parents that, contractually, Belvedere teachers are not permitted to offer private lessons to students within our school community, and if doing so, risk their employment in the school.

We are occasionally asked why the school discourages private tuition. The reason is rooted in the principle of fairness and safequarding student wellbeing. Private tutoring-particularly when conducted by a student's own teacher—creates a clear conflict of interest. It risks favouritism. whether academically, socially, or in preparation for external exams. This undermines the integrity of classroom learning and damages

















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VICE PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

This article is not about our teachers; it is about our overall stance on private tutoring from external sources.

We kindly ask for your support in discouraging private tuition. External tutors are not aligned with our schemes of work and often operate without a full understanding of the student's academic pathway. In some cases, their primary motivation may be financial, leading to unnecessary or prolonged sessions that offer little benefit. More concerningly, reliance on private tutors can lead to a pattern of spoon-feeding, reducing the student's ability to think independently; a skill that is essential not just for exams, but for success in higher education and beyond.

I have encountered external teachers from other schools who have openly admitted to withholding key information in class, only to offer it during private sessions. This is clearly unethical and not in the best interest of any child.

To help reflect on this issue, we invite you to consider the following questions:

- If the school provides everything a student needs, what is the real added value of private tuition?
- Could private tutoring send the wrong message; that success depends on being "coached" rather than working independently?
- Is it fair for some students to receive additional, often expensive, help that others may not afford or access?

- Should we risk placing our children in a system that promotes dependency over resilience?
- Wouldn't it be better to focus on building confidence, responsibility, and trust in their teachers?

Research conducted globally, including by UNESCO and the OECD, has highlighted growing concerns around the rise of private tutoring. While intended to supplement learning, such tutoring can inadvertently widen educational gaps, reduce student motivation, and create dependence on external help rather than encouraging self-regulation and resilience. Studies have also noted that students engaged in frequent tutoring may underperform in problem-solving tasks that require independent thinking.

Closer to home, the UAE Ministry of Education and ADEK have repeatedly emphasised that private tuition should not replace or undermine structured school learning. ADEK regulations discourage private tutoring unless officially approved, noting that unregulated tuition can lead to inconsistencies in learning and excessive academic pressure.

We urge you to <u>trust the process</u> and guidance provided by our teachers, who have your child's best interests at heart. Should you have any concerns or become aware of any discrepancies relating to private tuition arrangements, we encourage you to raise them with us directly and confidentially.

Together, let us say no to private tuition and yes to fairness, independence, and long-term student success. CONT...
